MEI GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

Every student enrolled in Grade 10, 11 or 12 at MEI must meet the MEI graduation requirements below, by the end of Grade 12. By doing so, students will receive the **Dogwood Diploma** from the BC Ministry of Education. MEI Students must complete a minimum of **80 credits** in grades 10, 11 and 12 credits. Below is the breakdown of required and elective credit requirement. Students should prepare well to ensure they get the credits they need to achieve their goals.

BC SECOND LANGUAGE INFORMATION

High School Graduation Requirement

A second language is **optional in grades 9 – 12** and is not required for high school graduation.

In order to take French or Spanish 10, 11 or 12 at MEI, students must have successfully completed French 9 or Spanish 9. Students can switch from French 8 and move on to Spanish 9 without prior Spanish knowledge.
