

Second Language Required for some Universities

- We encourage you to do thorough research into post-secondary requirements
- UFV, B.Arts: A grade 11 second language or equivalent is required for all students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree. Students without a grade 11 language will need to complete a first year modern language course as part of their university studies.
 - You can still apply to B.Arts program at UFV without a second language 11
- Students and parents are encouraged to consider the benefits in learning an additional language
 - Language 12 is an academic grade 12 course
 - Personal growth
 - Increases global and cultural knowledge
 - Future travel, meeting new people

Humanities and Modern Language Electives

Course	Description
20th Century History 12	Topics include civil, ethnic, cultural, and global conflicts and revolutions, authoritarian regimes, international cooperation, social/cultural trends and developments.
Law Studies 12	Legal rights and responsibilities, and how Canada's current legal framework affects our everyday lives.
Physical Geography 12	Processes and features of the natural world and how humans interact with it. Topics include research methods, earth forces, meterology, biomes, and sustainability.
Core French 11	Develop proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing through various texts, media and situations.
Spanish 11	Develop proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Topics include school life, leisure, daily routines, conversation, and Hispanic culture.


Sciences

Course	Description
Chemistry 11	Study of the composition, structure and properties of matter; chemical reactions, atomic theory, solution and organic chemistry.
Chemistry 11 Honours	Advanced curriculum; preparation for Chemistry 12 Honours and Advanced Placement exam
Environmental Science 11	Studies the complex relationships that exist in nature and how natural forces and human practices affect them.
Life Science 11	Topics include the molecular and cellular levels of living things, evolution and natural selection, and the 5 kingdoms of living organisms.
Physics 11	Topics include kinematics, vector dynamics, work and energy, power and efficiency, electric circuits, properties of waves and sound.
Specialized Science (Agriculture) 12	This hands-on course works in MEI's greenhouse and agricultural land, focusing on sustainability, stewardship, ecosystems and agricultural technologies.

Drafting 11	Architectural design and mechanical drafting, construction methods, theory of residential design
Foods Studies 11	Cooking and baking skills, meal-planning, 3-course meal creation, the food system and its sustainability
Marketing and Promotion 11	Students apply marketing concepts, operations and techniques to retailing and selling; operate school café and cafeteria
Robotics 11	Explores the field of Electronics and Robotics; can enter projects in various competitions/showcases
Textiles 11	Developing and advancing sewing skills
Woodworking 11	Design, plan and construct projects from start to finish; develop knowledge of types of wood and their structural and aesthetic applications
