You will use your MyEducation BC Login ID and password that you used to access Term 1 report cards.



Literacy Assessment 12 (completed in grade 12)

- Students and parents should ensure that the required courses have been successfully completed in previous grades and that course selections for next year will ensure the student is on-track to meet graduation requirements.
- School Counsellors will complete Grad Credit checks at the end of September and may need to make changes to your schedule to ensure graduation.



Online Courses & Study Blocks

MEI Secondary School does not give a study period in place of online courses taken. If students, or their families, choose to enroll in an online course, that will be in addition to the courses they are taking at the school, not in place of.

Students in Grade 12 are permitted to receive one Study Block for the year.

Because our ultimate academic goal is to graduate our students, MEI Secondary School reserves the right to hold all graduation-requirement courses within the timetable of the student until they can prove they have completed the online version of the course.

Child and Caregiving 12	Child development from the prenatal stage to teenage years, physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Students will explore various child development theories.
Foods Studies 12	Cooking and baking skills, meal-planning, 3-course meal creation, the food system and its sustainability
Robotics 11	Explores the field of Electronics and Robotics; can enter projects in various competitions/showcases
Textiles 12	Developing and advancing sewing skills

Art Studio 12	Advancement in drawing, painting, mixed media, sculpture and printmaking; historical and contemporary progress, personal expression
Concert Choir 12	Develop musical theoretical concepts and singing ability; perform challenging choral arrangements at a variety of venues
Drama 12	Enhance theatre skills including pantomime, improvisation, monologue, choreography, blocking, lighting, vocal production
Film & TV 12	Learn elements of film production to create short films and live broadcasts, using cutting-edge videography equipment
Instrumental Music: Concert Band 12	High-level performance and commitment; performs at various concerts and festivals throughout the year
Studio Arts 2D 12	A second art class for serious art students working independently to produce a strong portfolio with depth and meaning

Advanced PE 12	Designed for high-performance athletes: plyometrics, weights, jump, agility, core, aerobic, anaerobic and skills; nutrition, sports psychology (depends on available equipment and facilities: next year will focus on basketball and volleyball)

Secondary Teacher Assistant 12 (not an ADST course)	90 hours mentorship by a MEI Secondary sponsor teacher in a "pre- practicum" context
Youth Work in Trades (ADST) Grades 11 & 12	4 courses of 120 hours work/volunteer experience, plus 2 online courses. Students are responsible for finding their own placement in a trade.
